DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY 1ST MAY: St. Aidan's, Kinlough, Confessions from 2.30pm. Mass and Devotions at 3.00pm. From St. Faustina's Diary it is clear that this Octave Day of Easter is chosen by Christ as a day of extraordinary graces – a complete outpouring of His mercy upon all who approach Him with great trust and expectant faith. Jesus told Saint Faustina “mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of Mercy”.

Divine Mercy is now a public feast of the church by an official instruction given by Pope John Paul II on 5th May, 2000.

To prepare for this great Feast of Mercy and to obtain all the graces offered it is necessary to comply with the following:

- The Feast should be preceded by a Novena of Chaplets to the Divine Mercy beginning on Good Friday and finishing nine days later on the Saturday. (Leaflets containing this Novena available at church doors).
- Sermon on Divine Mercy.
- Contemplating on this day, the mystery of Redemption.
- Image of Divine Mercy blessed and publicly venerated.
- Confession on or before the Feast.
- Holy Communion on the day.
- An act of mercy should take place in our lives, as part of our preparation for the feast. We should be merciful to others in our words, deeds and prayers.

EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS BELL VISITS DIOCESE (18th to 29th MAY):

The Eucharistic Congress Bell is a key symbol of the 50th International Eucharistic Congress. The bell will be carried in pilgrimage around the country as well as to Britain, France and Spain during the coming year. The Bell will also be accompanied by four specially commissioned icons symbolizing the four stages of preparation for the Congress ***Gathering, The Word, Breaking Bread and Mission***. The Bell will reflect the invitation to faith, to prayer, to reconciliation and to mission in which has always been important in our Christian tradition and is no less so today.

Each Parish will be asked to provide at least **12 volunteers** to carry the bell on its journey through the diocese. Volunteers must be over 18 years of age. Information and training nights for these volunteers will be provided.

The volunteers from the Kinlough-Glenade parish will receive the bell from the Manorhamilton volunteers at the border between the two parishes sometime on the evening of **May 28th** and carry it to Kinlough Church for a service at **6.30pm**. The bell and the accompanying icons will stay in the Church overnight and a vigil service will be provided for churches where it will stay overnight. The bell will leave Kinlough at **12.00 noon** on Sunday and will be handed over to Elphin Diocese at **1.30pm** at Tullaghan.
