DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY 27th APRIL 2014: St. Aidan's, Kinlough, Confessions from 2.30pm. Mass and Devotions at 3.00pm.

From St. Faustina's Diary it is clear that this Octave Day of Easter is chosen by Christ as a day of extraordinary graces – a complete outpouring of His mercy upon all who approach Him with great trust and expectant faith. Jesus told Saint Faustina "The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of Mercy".

This year, 2014 is a very special year with the canonization of Pope John Paul II and Pope John XXIII. Pope John Paul was a great influence on the development and promotion of Divine Mercy. His deep awareness of the life and works of St. Faustina and his knowledge of the difficulties in the early days of the message being accepted brought him very close to the Divine Mercy spirituality. Canonising St. Faustina in year 2000 was one of the highlights of his papacy. He died on the vigil of Divine Mercy and now few years later, he is being canonised on the Feast of Divine Mercy which is a great tribute to him. Pope John Paul is in fact very much part of the Divine Mercy story.

Divine Mercy is now a public feast of the church by an official instruction given by Pope John Paul II on 5th May, 2000.

To prepare for this great Feast of Mercy and to obtain all the graces offered it is necessary to comply with the following:

- The Feast should be preceded by a Novena of Chaplets to the Divine Mercy beginning on Good Friday and finishing nine days later on the Saturday.
- Sermon on Divine Mercy.
- Contemplating on this day, the mystery of Redemption.
- Image of Divine Mercy blessed and publicly venerated.
- Confession on or before the Feast.
- Holy Communion on the day.
- An act of mercy should take place in our lives, as part of our preparation for the feast. We should be merciful to others in our words, deeds and prayers.

The preceding novena will be recited in Saint Aidan's Church, Kinlough, starting Good Friday after the 3 p.m. devotions and at 3 p.m. on all the following days up to and including Saturday 26th April. People who wish to take part in the novena can do so in the church at the Divine mercy image or privately in their own homes. Leaflets containing this novena are available at the church door.
