Marriage is important – Reflect before you change it

Marriage is of fundamental importance for children, mothers and fathers, and society – all of us need to reflect deeply before changing it. Ahead of the referendum in May, bishops ask the faithful to carefully consider:

- that the union of a man and a woman in marriage, open to the procreation of children, is a gift from God who created us male and female
- that reason points to the truth about human sexuality that makes the relationship between a man and a woman unique
- that mothers and fathers bring different, yet complementary gifts and strengths into a child's life
- the profound implications which this constitutional amendment would have on the family environment and on our understanding of parenthood

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY 12th APRIL 2015: St. Aidan's, Kinlough, Confessions from 2.30pm. Mass and Devotions at 3.00pm.

From St. Faustina's Diary it is clear that this Octave Day of Easter is chosen by Christ as a day of extraordinary graces – a complete outpouring of His mercy upon all who approach Him with great trust and expectant faith. Jesus told Saint Faustina "The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of Mercy"

Divine Mercy is now a public feast of the church by an official instruction given by Pope John Paul II on 5th May, 2000.

To prepare for this great Feast of Mercy and to obtain all the graces offered it is necessary to comply with the following:

- The Feast should be preceded by a Novena of Chaplets to the Divine Mercy beginning on Good Friday and finishing nine days later on the Saturday.
- Sermon on Divine Mercy.
- Contemplating on this day, the mystery of Redemption.
- Image of Divine Mercy blessed and publicly venerated.
- Confession on or before the Feast.
- Holy Communion on the day.
- An act of mercy should take place in our lives, as part of our preparation for the feast. We should be merciful to others in our words, deeds and prayers.

The preceding novena will be recited in Saint Aidan's Church, Kinlough, starting Good Friday after the 3 p.m. devotions and at 3 p.m. on all the following days up to and including Saturday 26th April. People who wish to take part in the novena can do so in the church at the Divine mercy image or privately in their own homes. Leaflets containing this novena are available at the church door.
